Arudra Darisanam -Thiruvadirai Viratham

Falling on the day of Thiruvadirai star in the Tamil month of Marghazhi (November-December), is a festival of great importance. The sweet dish offering on this day, Thiruvadirai kali, is something with which all are familiar. Arudra star is one of two stars that have the prefix "Thiru." The other is Thiruvonam, favoured for worship of Maha Vishnu. Thiruvadirai is favoured for Lord Shiva.

Ancient texts say Arudra is the largest of the stars. Juxtaposed against it, planet Earth is smaller than the point of a needle. According to astronomers if you place Arudra where the Sun is, the star will extend beyond the earth and touch Sevvai (Mars). Arudra denotes a red flame.

We call Shiva Semporjyoti or the Golden Red Flame. Lord Shiva performs His functions of creation, protection, destruction, embodiment and release, representing the continuous cycle of creation and destruction, in the form of light. Nataraja is the manifestation of Lord Shiva as light. In Marghazhi, the day when the star Thiruvadirai and new moon coincide, we celebrate the ecstatic dance of Shiva.

Once Maha Vishnu was lying on the great serpent Adhishesha. Adhishesha felt that Maha Vishnu was quite heavy. He asked Maha Vishnu the reason for him feeling His weight. Maha Vishnu said that He was remembering and enjoying the Dance of Lord Shiva.

Once the sages were performing yagam for Lord Shiva. The Lord visited the houses of the sages as Pichadavar (beggar) and the wives of the sages forgot themselves and followed the Lord. The sages in anger produced elephant, Muyalagan, udukkai (hourglass-shaped drum), deer, etc. from the yaga fire and tried to attack the Lord with them. The Lord killed the elephant and wore its hide along with the other objects. He stood on Muyalagan with His right leg and began to dance. The sages then realized their error and asked for His forgiveness. This divine sight is Arudra Darisanam.



The answer developed the desire in Adhishesha to see the great Dance of Lord Shiva. He asked Maha Vishnu how his desire could be fulfilled. Maha Vishnu asked him to go to Chidambaram and do "tapas". Adhishesha came to Chidambaram and prayed to the Lord for a long time. At the same time, there was another muni and devotee of Lord Shiva, called Viyaagraapaadha who prayed to Lord Shiva to give him the legs of a tiger, so that he can pluck flowers early in the morning to offer to Him, before any bee touches the flower. Also, he wanted to see Lord Shiva's dance. Pleased with both their prayers the Lord appeared on Thiruvaadhirai day and danced at Chidambaram. Appar has written a separate pathigam in Tevaram under the title **Thiruvathirai Pathigam** describing the importance and celebrations of Thiruvathirai.



Lord Shiva as Nataraja is worshipped with great devotion on this day at Chidambaram in Tamil Nadu. A maha abhishekam that lasts for 3-4 hours for the Lord is performed and He is then taken around the town in procession with His consort Sivagamasundari, Lord Ganesha, Lord Muruga and Sandeekeshwarar in the Temple Chariot (Ther). The Deities are then brought to the 1000 pillar mandapam for special prayers and Laksharchanai.



The sweet preparation kali along with multi vegetable thaalakam is offered to the Lord and distributed as prasadam to all the devotees. Obtaining the kali prasadam connotes the devotees' attainment of bliss through the Lord. There is an anecdote about how kali came to be the prasadam on this day.

A devotee called Sendanar had the habit of eating only whatever was left of the food offered to the Lord and then distributed among other devotees. On Thiruvadirai day in a Marghazhi, he could offer to the Almighty only some pittu and kali. With much regret that he could get nothing better, he offered these to the Lord. As he stood a little later in Nataraja's sanctorum, the Lord effected a shower of pittu and kali on Sendanar in recognition of his deep devotion. Since the day of that miracle, kali is the special offering to Lord Nataraja on Marghazhi Thiruvadirai.

At Sirghazhi in Tamil Nadu, this day is celebrated as the birth anniversary of Saint ThiruGnanaSambandar. It is also the day when the Saint as a baby was breastfed by Parvati. And in Thirupperundurai, Tamil Nadu, this day is observed as the birthday of Saint Manickavachakar.

Thiruvadirai Viratham



Sri Skandha puranam describes Thiruvadirai viratham. This viratham is to be observed when the sun shines in the Dhanur rasi in the month of Markazhi on the day of Thiruvadirai star. Rudra is the devata for this viratham.

On the morning of thiruvAdhirai people get up early to offer salutations to the Dancing Lord. After bathing they go to the temple to take part in the abhishekam rituals. Lord Shiva is worshipped with ghee lamps. People fast the whole day and on the next day, they partake food after prayers to the Lord and serving food to the other devotees.

As the Lord is dancing blissfully and gracefully on this day this viratham is considered quite auspicious to please Lord Shiva and be showered with His blessings.

Sanathana Dharma Sansthan: Hinduism classes for children

Hinduism classes for children started in February 2009 with about 6 students in a make shift office and is successfully completing 11 years this year with 60 enrolments, with classes conducted in the Cultural Centre. With the blessings of the almighty the classes are running smoothly, and the student numbers are steadily increasing. The classes are conducted using English as the medium, every Friday evening between 7.00 pm and 8.30 pm. The classes contain three age groups between the ages of 4 and 13.

Children are taught about the Gods, Saints, Temples, Festivals, the two great Epics and Hindu Ethics as well as Devotional songs including Thevaram, Bhajans, etc.

In addition to the classroom learning our children are also participating in play and singing activities staged during Navarathiri celebrations and annual concerts. This year's performance included Bhaktaprahlad. The performances of the children during the Navarathiri celebration were of high standard and well appreciated by audience and parents. In addition to learning, these activities motivate the children and improve their self-confidence and make them feel proud of their religion and culture.

We notice that the children are participating in the class activities with great enthusiasm. We appreciate the commitment shown by the parents in bringing their children to the Hinduism classes. A parent's club has been formed over the years and this dedicated parents' group is providing assistance for the overall running of the school.

The classes are conducted by experienced teachers, Mrs Mangalam Vasan, Mr Kugan Kugathanan and Ms Lakshanya Vasan. Mrs. Medini Balachandran has joined to help in the smooth running of the classes this year.
